

The General Convention of the Episcopal Church is approaching

Many of us don't like to talk about the National Church and what they do. The feeling seems to be that since we are in Wyoming, and 815 Second Avenue in Manhattan (the central church office) is a long way away, much that happens does not affect us. In some ways this is true, but we are part of the Episcopal Church and everything that happens on the big stage will eventually trickle down to us. Every three years the church gathers on a national level for General Convention. It is the event where changes on a church wide level are discussed and either enacted or shot down.

This year is one of those General Convention years and I will be there as a deputy from Wyoming, along with Laura Galloway who is a lay alternate, to see it all firsthand and participate in the discussion and debates. This is my first as a deputy and I have no idea what to expect but will be keeping notes and reflections to share with you all. So in honor of the upcoming General Convention I offer a brief overview of what it is as an introduction or refresher.

When and where is General Convention? General Convention is in Salt Lake City from June 24th-July 3rd. There is a special event on June 23rd that is a town hall interview with the candidates for the next Presiding Bishop.

Who attends General Convention? Technically anyone can attend, but each Diocese sends 8 deputies with voice and vote to serve in the House of Deputies. I am one of the clergy deputies along with Joel Dingman (Casper), Kay Flores (Casper) and Mary Caucutt (Cody). Our lay deputies are Thad Hunter (Casper), Jay Moody (Cody), Mary Naumann (Laramie) and Cindy King (Casper).

How is it structured? General Convention is modeled after the US Congress in the sense that there are two legislative houses. The House of Deputies includes the 8 deputies from each diocese, while the House of Bishops includes Bishop Smylie and every current Bishop in the Episcopal Church. For a resolution or proposed change to pass, it must pass both houses.

What's on the docket for this General Convention? There are hundreds of pieces of legislation that will be brought to Committee's at this year's Convention, many will be "killed" in Committee or combined with other similar pieces to try to streamline the process. There are three big areas of discussion.

Restructuring church governance – proposals in this area include moving the church office from Manhattan to a central location that is less expensive, combining the House of Bishops and House of Deputies for a more efficient Convention, allowing Dioceses to work towards sharing Committee's, eliminating most Committee's on a national level (currently there are 27 and the proposal reduces them to 4) as well changing the process by which a Bishop is elected to be more transparent.

Amending the canons on marriage – The proposed change is to the language in the marriage canon to be gender neutral (note: this change will not change the prayer book).

The Election of a new Presiding Bishop – the PB is the chair of the House of Bishops and is the public face of the church. Katherine Jefferts Schiori is the current PB and her term is up. Each PB serves a 9 year term and is elected only by the House of Bishops. The nominees this year are Michael Curry (North Carolina) Ian Douglas (Connecticut) Dabney Smith (Southwest Florida) and Thomas Brednethal (Southern Ohio).

What can you hold without your hands?

Last month I mentioned I have been reading a lot of Christian biography lately and recommended a few books I have found especially good. This month I wanted to share something I have learned. As I have read a large number of stories about Christians who have been greatly used by God to impact the world, I have noticed one characteristic they all possess and place great emphasis upon. Can you guess what it might be?

Obedience. Time and again I have read about a singular commitment to *obey the will of God*, whatever it happens to be. There are many other important attributes these individuals possess. They study and know scripture; they pray frequently; they depend upon God in faith. And yet it is their ready obedience that seems to be the key to unlocking the fuller life with God and that sets theirs apart from the average Christian experience.

It probably goes without saying that very few are prepared to offer this sort of obedience to God. The more ordinary course is to follow God in some matters while in others to adopt various strategies of resisting his will. (Sometimes we just flat out refuse to do as he says. Other times we pretend we don't know what he says. Still other times, we scrupulously avoid giving any reflective attention to an area of our lives we suspect God might want to deal with.) Why do we hold back?

The other day I was trying to coax Noah into jumping off a high point of a play structure. "I'll catch you," I said. He wouldn't jump. The problem was that he had doubts about my ability to catch him safely. It is the same way with our obedience to God. We hold back because we aren't sure he has our good in mind or aren't sure he's fully in control of things. To carry on with the metaphor, we suspect he might drop us due to ineptitude or malice.

But here's the truth: God wills only our good and God is able, as Paul says, to work *all* things together for that end. If we really believe that, we won't hesitate to "jump."

And how do we come to believe that, you ask? I think people tend to develop trust in God the same way we develop trust in people: through experience. Start where you are. Ask God to prompt you to take a step of obedience and then see what happens. The more we find God faithful the more willing we will be to take more (and larger) steps.


