News and notes on what's coming up at St. Peter's

Rodeo Sunday and the Duprey Family – I have invited Father Dave and his children to provide some of the music for our service on July 16th, which is Rodeo Sunday. They will all be in town that week and I thought this would be a fun way to celebrate that Sunday.

Baptism Sunday – The Book of Common Prayer encourages Baptisms on Easter, Pentecost, All Saints Day and the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the Sunday after Epiphany) but does allow for other days at the discretion of the Rector. I am naming September 10th as one of those "other days" and it will be a special Baptism Sunday as we celebrate the 105th Anniversary of St. Peter's. We have a few Baptisms lined up and If you or someone you know has been curious about Baptism, please have them contact me or the church office.

Rearranging the Balcony – One of the things I noticed while I was in Seattle visiting an Episcopal church there was an area on the side of the church for moms with babies. It was not anything remarkable, just a space set aside with some pillows on the floor and a few chairs so a mom (or dad) could let their child stretch and get the wiggles out during service or feed their child and still participate. I went and asked some of the moms there why they liked it and they said it was because they could still participate in the service. I have talked to a few of our new moms here and noticed many go sit on steps or head in the basement to feed their children because they still want to try to participate in the service.

I spoke to Vestry about this and it was agreed that we could make some space in the balcony for moms to feed their children or kids who might need some "tummy time" to lay on a blanket while parents can still participate in the service. We have a wonderful nursery that is great for mobile kids and toddlers but this may be something that helps parents of newborns and infants participate in the service. I am not sure what this exactly will look like yet, but nothing that will change the structure or integrity of the church. I will be working with the Junior Warden and Hospitality Committee on this. I want to reiterate how vital it is for people to be able to participate in the liturgy and worship of St. Peter's and how important it is for us to be inclusive in finding ways for people to be able to participate. Stay tuned for more information in the coming weeks.

PLEASE READ ROMANS 6:1-23 Grace: God Beyond the Boundaries



The whole concept of grace is confusing to us. That is particularly unfortunate since it is pretty much the fundamental point of the gospel. We can at least take comfort in knowing that the Romans had a hard time understanding it as well. The apostle Paul spent most of his letter to the Romans explaining God's grace over and over again. It is as if to say that an illustration of how badly we need grace is the fact that we can't quite understand it.

Grace is better than the fulfillment of all our dreams. It is the fulfillment of God's dream -- our forgiveness. Grace means that God gives us what we need and not what we deserve.

It isn't really a difficult concept to understand, but that is not what confuses us. It's the gift that we can't quite accept. Do we really want what we don't deserve? We may not have been perfect, but we certainly have been careful. Don't we deserve something for trying so hard? Trust me on this. When it comes to standing before God, getting what we deserve is the last thing we want.

Receiving God's grace shakes the very foundations of our carefully constructed lives. It calls us to start all over and begin to live a passionate drama with this lover God who will do anything to save us. We even have to lose our interest in carefully constructed lives because, well, that may be the greatest sin of all.


Rates:

Lodging: Adult (13+) \$15; Child (6-12) \$10; Child (0-5) Free Meals: Adults (13+) \$10 per meal; Child (6-12) \$7.00 per meal; Child (0-2) \$2.00 per meal, (3-5) \$4.00 per meal.

Housing is in shared bunk houses equipped with bunk beds. You will need to bring bedding and a towel. We will set aside one bunk house for women only and one for men only. Families should be able to find an area to stay together (there are five bunk houses in total).
