Anything else? The first service will be Tuesday June 6th and continue Tuesdays throughout the summer (with the exception of Tuesday July 4th - there will be no service that day.)

Dear Vestry,

I pray that this letter finds you all well, and blessed in the fellowship we enjoy together in our Lord, Jesus Christ.

As I complete my ninth year as a Navy Chaplain, I still look back to find St. Peter's as my home church foundation. Through regular correspondence with members, to the business transactions with local services, my home is still in Wyoming! My thanks extend to Fr. John and all the staff, who continue to forward mail and keep me posted on the activities of the church.

In my recent communication with Jim Benepe regarding the Malcolm Wallop Chaplaincy Fund, it was again a great blessing to recommend one of our local Camp Lejeune Chaplains for consideration of a scholarship.

Throughout my time in service, I have met some great chaplains, but it is rare to find chaplains ministering to chaplains. When I have had occasion to pull a chaplain away for a confidential conversation, I cannot explain the humble joy that I have seen on their faces when I have quietly inquired something like: "Hey, I noticed (or heard from the Bishop) that you might be in a financial difficulty. I have access to a special fund which might be able to provide you some assistance. Would you consider allowing me to do that for you?"

In each case (which leads me to believe the Holy Spirit was involved) the chaplains have readily received the offer of assistance, and this exchange has strengthened the bonds that already existed between us.

You may not be fully aware of the back-story. When I first considered chaplaincy, I inquired into our local National Guard to become their chaplain, while I was the Rector of

St. Peter's and with three children at home. When I found out that the commitment would require 12 weeks of training, I pulled the process, immediately concluding that I could not be away from the church and my children that long.

In the throes of my disappointment from not being able to serve, I went to see Malcolm Wallop at his office downtown. He tried to reassure me that I was serving my country, right where I was. The pep talk may have helped, but I certainly didn't feel better.

Then, some seven (or so) years later, when I entered the Navy on an age waiver, Malcolm was one of the first people I notified.

I am also aware that I am not the first Rector to serve as a chaplain, and The Rev. Donald Smith was a major source of inspiration to me as I made my decision.

I was overwhelmed when I heard that Malcolm's family had agreed to dedicate a portion of the St. Peter's gift to the Chaplaincy Fund. Now Jim tells me that you have decided to contribute your plate offering from your July 4 Military Appreciation service to the fund. That is just incredible!

Thank you all for maintaining this wonderful link between the ministry of St. Peter's and the chaplaincy. This is just one way in which our relationship is kept alive.

I look forward to seeing you all when I come to visit on Sunday, 16 July. I should have most of my children and grands with me that day, as we will have completed a big week in our family's life. Jeremy will be ordained as a Lutheran Pastor (ELCA) in Big Timber, MT, on Saturday, 8 July, and his last Sunday at Big Timber Lutheran will be Sunday, 9 July. We are all looking forward to Rodeo and gathering together for worship at St. Peter's.

For all this and so much more I remain eternally grateful.
