#### Holy Week, Reconciliation, and opportunities to build bridges.

Holy Week is approaching fast as it is the last week in March, March 20-27 to be specific. This year Holy Week seems to be an opportunity for us to build bridges and reconcile. Reconciliation is the work Jesus came to do and the work he gave us to do after his resurrection. St. Paul says it like this,

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 2 Cor 5:17-19

It is not exactly going out on a limb to say we are a divided nation and people. Despite all the education and technology at our disposal, we need the ministry of reconciliation as much now as we ever have.

We may not be able to fix divisions all at once, but we can work on our corner of the world and see what we can do. In Holy Week we have several opportunities to come together with one another and with other Christians in town. I know you all are busy, but I hope that in this holiest of weeks, you can make some time to remember the important work of reconciliation Jesus did on the Cross, and the call for us to continue that work

Palm Sunday – March 20<sup>th</sup> at 9am (One service this Sunday) – This is our chance to come together as a parish. As we celebrate the highs and lows of the Lord's final week with readings and music. Personally I enjoy this service as it involves readers and servers from both services.

Maundy Thursday – March 24<sup>th</sup> at 6pm – This is our chance to come together with some of the Pastors in town as we participate in the liturgy of Maundy Thursday. Tony Foreman and Cody Haar (Cornerstone Church), Gary Kopsa (VOA) John Constantine (Story Community Church) Claude Alley (Ranchester Community Church and VOA Homeless Shelter) and more will join together as we pray, reflect on the word of God, wash feet and share Communion (we will wash our hands in between feet and communion, I promise.)

Good Friday – March 25<sup>th</sup> at 12 noon – The tradition of multiple pastors preaching on a common text for this service continues. Phil Wold (Trinity Lutheran) Doug Melius (First Presbyterian) Don Derryberry (First United Methodist) and Doug Goodwin (First Christian) and others will preach on Luke 23:43 when Jesus tells one thief on the Cross "*Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.*"

These services are opportunities for us to come together as a parish and as a Christian community. It's not perfect yet, but it's a start. What you should be encouraged by and grateful for, is that God is using St. Peter's to be an agent of reconciliation in this community.

Last month I shared some stories about students and will do the same this month as well. Some of these will be updates about students I wrote of before, while others are new.

Ya: Ya is a Chinese woman who married a Lithuanian man who was working in her country. She has been living in Lithuania now for around four years and has been studying at LCC most of that time. She says she needed something to do. The fact that the program was in English, a language she knew, made this a good fit.

I found out that she has serious health problems--which often result in her missing class. Her vocabulary in such things is limited, but it seems she has growths of some kind in her intestines and other digestive system problems that are chronic and often quite severe. She will have days where she is in so much pain that she cannot do anything. She also often has blood in her stool. She is finding it difficult to get much help in these matters since the medical system here is not great and she can't speak Lithuanian. Her husband works on oil rigs and will be gone for five weeks at a time. She is only willing to go to the doctor when he can be with her. I'm not sure how good that relationship is; another faculty member told me there have been concerns that he is abusive. It is a difficult situation, since there is little I can do except pray for her and try to encourage her as I am able.

Her time at LCC has opened up to her the idea of God, something she had never thought about before. She says she prays sometimes and has been interested in what she has learned about God. It is not clear to me how much she understands, however. At least it seems her faith is not robust enough at this point to be much of a sustaining force in her struggles.

Alina: Alina is from Kazakhstan and will be graduating in December. She grew up in a Muslim home, but tells me it was mostly just a cultural thing. She desired to study outside her country because the education system there is so corrupt, and became aware of LCC through an acquaintance.

I have noticed during the class that she is one of the students who pays careful attention and there seems to be something going on inside. This morning I asked her if she'd like to sit down for tea to talk about the class and what she's been thinking about. We had a very fruitful discussion about faith. She is interested in Christianity but also put off by certain aspects of it. We talked through her objections and she seemed to find it very helpful.

*Ingrida*: I wrote about her last time around; she has proved a very outspoken and provocative member of the class--but in a way I think has been helpful to discussion. We had a very long talk yesterday afternoon, initiated by her. She said she wanted to hear my story because she didn't understand why someone who

seemed rational and normal would be so invested in institutional Christianity, which to her seems impossibly constricting. Sometimes it is hard to know if a conversation accomplishes anything, but I hope I was at least able to demonstrate a genuine care and concern for her as a person. She shared with me something of her past, which contains some very painful experiences and negative interactions with Christians. I was reminded of how incredibly important our lives are as witnesses (or not) to the truth of what we proclaim.

*Dmitri*: Dmitri has recently found out that he was accepted to business school in Rochester, NY. He is waiting to hear from several other schools. We had another long talk about faith a week or so ago. He says he really likes (and tries to live) the moral message of Christianity, but doesn't see the necessity of any kind of relationship with God. He says he can be moral on his own. Maybe it is easy to think that when you are young (and single, and without children). Leaving aside whether he is right about this (I think it is possible only in a limited sense), I tried to point out that the real issue isn't whether we think we need God but that he has made us for relationship with Himself and invites us into it. How are we going to respond to the invitation?

*leva*: Last month I described her as my angry student. She has softened in her demeanor in class, but I can't say she is particularly engaged. We sat down for tea a couple of weeks ago and had a great conversation. She told me she has never been able to believe in God, even though at times she has wanted to. The conversation led to a consideration of whether her pride wasn't standing in the way of her really being open to God in her life. She admitted that she wants to be in charge and in control. She is afraid that if she starts exploring faith God is going to mess with her life in ways she won't like. Here she is certainly on to something. Even though it can be difficult, though, God always moves us in the direction of our good. The great lie that Satan told so long ago and tells still is that God just wants to ruin our fun.

Katya: I will keep this one brief but want to mention one more student. Katya tells me she is a pagan, and what this amounts to is a bewildering mix of beliefs and practices that she has adopted from various sources. As I spoke with her I recognized a kind of spiritual confusion I have seen before. One has the sense in speaking with her that there are no solid places to stand from which to begin to reason with her.

Please pray for these students as you are led. I approach my work here with "fear and trembling," knowing well how little I have of my own to give and how much I depend upon God to work in hearts and guide my words. I think of all those praying for us back in the US and it is an encouragement to me. Your part is so important.

Our family is doing well. If you read the blog, you will have some sense of what is going on in our everyday life. We are all looking forward to spring break, which begins at the end of this coming week. We hope to spend lots of time together as a family and I hope to get all my ducks in a row for the second part of the term. We will take a short trip to the capital, Vilnius, in the middle of the week. There will be lots of interesting pictures to look forward to.


