





Sometimes a story is too good not to tell. This is one of those stories.

Let me start by saying that I appreciate the church carpet project and when it was over I was happy to be done for the year with major maintenance projects. I enjoyed our time in the parish hall but was happy to have our space back in the church. Our Building Committee, which spearheaded that project, is fantastic; they work hard to make sure this facility is taken care of so we do not fall into disrepair. One of the things that has been on the horizon of the Building Committee is the roof of the church. The roof is nearing the end of its life and has been for some time, in 2011 some patching was done with the attempt to buy 5 more years of life, you and I can do the math to say that 5 years is up this year.

Let me go back a bit and say that one of the assets of the Building Committee is a property the church holds in Story and has since 1942. It was given to the church with the intention of being a camp but the land is very rugged and could never be developed. The church has held it since and has tried to sell it since 1979 - the same year I was born - this property has been for sale as long as I have been alive.

When I came to St. Peter's four years ago, early on I had a meeting with our Treasurer Dan Alsup who said completely serious, "The Story property is our new roof, when it sells we will know it's time to put the roof on the church." As the years have gone by I wavered but Dan never doubted that God indeed had a plan for that property to be our roof.

Flash forward to August 8th 2016. It is Monday and my day off, but I received two emails that morning. The first from Roger St. Clair telling me there was a serious cash offer on the property and a response was needed by the end of the week, the second was Jim Benepe from the Building Committee telling me that the annual roofing inspection was not good and the roof was in bad shape. I handed the property matter of (with Vestry approval) to a Subcommittee more qualified than me to make any decisions on this consisting of Mickey McNickle, Dan Alsup, Karen Ferguson and Senior Warden Patrick Henderson. They determined the offer was fair and accepted. We are under contract on the property.

At the Vestry meeting following on August 17 another Subcommittee was appointed to gather bids and make a decision to go forward with the roof. That group is Jim Benepe, Kurt Eisenach, Phil Dorsch, Senior Warden Patrick Henderson and fittingly the man who believed all along, our Treasurer Dan Alsup. They are meeting as we speak to evaluate bids and make the best long term decision for the church.

So we may not be done just yet, time will tell and I fully trust that group to make the best decision for the church. But I am thankful in God's abundance towards us. I tell this story to remind us all of how abundant God's blessings are, the power of faith, and how much he loves his church – how much he loves this church. Act with boldness and be generous too, for his abundance knows no limits. Indeed, a line we sing each and every week says it better than I can - Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Amen

You have by now hopefully heard about the book we'll be looking at together at St. Peter's this fall. Just in case, here are the details: The book is *Consider Your Calling*, by Gordon Smith. As we did last year, we will be connecting the sermons to the themes of the text for the six Sundays beginning September 18th (except for convention week). Also like last year, we will be creating a number of opportunities to work through the book with others in a small-group setting. I wanted to take the opportunity in this month's *Crossed Keys* to say just a bit more about the book for those who are not sure the study is right for them.

When we speak of "calling" and "vocation," it is natural to think about something pretty unique-something some lucky individuals have but most do not. Martin Luther King had a calling. Gandhi had a calling. Mother Theresa had a calling. But maybe you aren't used to applying these words to your own life. However, one of the points Smith is eager to make in the book is that each one of us has a calling (or vocation; the two words are basically the same idea in two languages). We are well aware of the fact that each one of us is unique, possessing our own blend of passions, experiences, gifts, and liabilities. Smith's contention is that this combination is no accident, but God's design for the unique role that each one of us is equipped to play. And so it is possible (and fruitful) for every one of us to ask ourselves, "What is the good work to which I am called?"

A vocation can also sound like a *big* thing. Think again of the examples I gave above. "I don't think I have been given any significant task like that!" we might say. But while vocation can be big, it needn't be. It isn't even most helpfully thought of as one particular job. Instead, it is the unique way that God calls us to participate in his work in the midst of our everyday circumstances. You may, for instance, have the vocation of a listener. You are wired for this, acutely aware of the need others have to be heard, and find joy in being a sympathetic ear. This is a capacity, a special gift to give, that you bring with you into your daily life and its myriad relationships, whether at home, at work, or at the post office. All of us, without exception, have something to give within the mundane details of ordinary life in our homes, schools, places of work, and in the church.

Finally, a vocation can sound like a younger person's thing. "I'm retired," you might be thinking; "I'm past the age of worrying about what I'm supposed to do with my life." But Smith also emphasizes that vocation is life-long, guiding us into the good work to which God has called us in every season of life. In many ways, he says, our senior years "may be some of the most fruitful and productive years of our lives." Every season has its opportunities to ask: What, now, is the good work to which God is calling me?
